Labor's Love Lost-Andrew J. Cherlin 2014-12-04 Two generations ago, young men and women with only a high-school degree would have entered the plentiful industrial occupations which then sustained the middle-class ideal of a male-breadwinner family. Such jobs have all but vanished over the past forty years, and in their absence ever-growing numbers of young adults now hold precarious, low-paid jobs with few fringe benefits. Facing such insecure economic prospects, less-educated young adults are increasingly forgoing marriage and are having children within unstable cohabiting relationships. To address this disparity, Cherlin recommends policies to foster educational opportunities for children and adolescents from disadvantaged families.
